The engraving copies an oil painting by Canaletto (Antonio Canal), entitled The Grand Canal Looking South-west from the Rialto to Ca' Foscari, of 1725–26. The plate is probably part of the set commissioned by Henry Fiennes Pelham-Clinton, 2nd Duke of Newcastle (1720–1794) during his Grand Tour of Italy.
